

Warning Signs

- "Injuries to the head, neck, chest, breasts, and abdomen; multiple sites or repeated injuries; and injuries during pregnancy"
- Patients who "have been <u>injured</u> in the head, face, neck, thorax, breasts, and abdomen"
- "[Patients] (are) more likely to have come for a routine physical examination, whereas abused [patients] (have) specific and often stress-related complaints."
- "Frequent medical visits for multiple <u>somatic complaints</u> such as fatigue, sexual dysfunction, chronic pelvic pain, headaches, chest pain, gastrointestinal disturbances, and abdominal pain may be linked to domestic abuse."
- "The <u>perpetrator often accompanies</u> the victim to the emergency department or the health-care provider's office and is unwilling to leave the victim alone.
- The perpetrator may be <u>overly attentive</u> to the victim and often is the one who relates the chief complaints and also answers for the patient."
- "Appears nervous, ashamed, or evasive; describes partner as <u>controlling</u> or prone to anger; gives unconvincing explanations of injuries."
- <u>Delays</u> in seeking medical attention
